ACLU of Nebraska

- \$50 pays for 1,000 "Know Your Rights" brochures for community members.
- \$75 a month provides informational sessions for DACA Youth on current immigration policy. (\$900)
- \$100 a month funds our "Know Your Rights" training sessions. (\$1200)

Angels Among Us

- \$50 will pay for gas for pediatric cancer treatment.
- \$5 per week will assist with credit card payments (\$260)
- \$10 per month will assist with groceries for a family who has to travel for treatment. (\$120)
